CagePrisoners is an independent advocacy group working to empower communities impacted by the War on Terror.

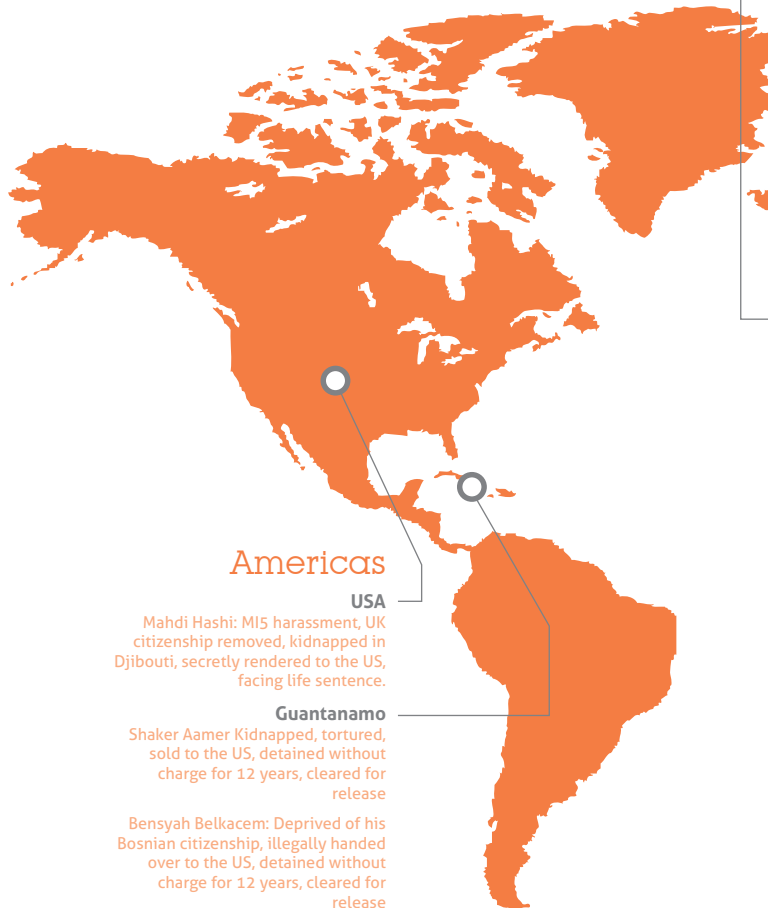
Outreach:

We have delivered over 750 lectures across the U.K., addressing over 80,000 people. Our representatives have participated in numerous human rights conferences nationally and internationally. Recently these conferences include legal and moral discussions on deportation, extradition, detention, rendition, human rights, entrapment, spying and Schedule 7 stops.

Prisoner support

CagePrisoners sends Eid gifts to over 100 detainees so that they can call their families and buy whatever they need to make their Eid more special.

Our team frequently advise the military and civil defence teams in Guantanamo and provide support to those unjustly detained across the world in the War on Terror. Upon release, CagePrisoners assists former detainees in their resettlement.

Munir Faraogi: No evidence of a plot and openly convicted to life for his ideas.

Ireland

Ali Charaf Damache: Pending extradition to the US, inhumane conditions of detention.

France

Djamel Beghal: Tortured in UAE, rendition, citizenship removed, already served a 10 year sentence.

Belgium

Nizar Trabelsi: 10 years in solitary confinement, pending extradition to the US.

Netherlands

Sabir K: Kidnapped in Pakistan, tortured, sent to Netherlands, pending extradition to the US.

Middle East

Iraq

Shawqi Omar: Kidnapped by US forces, tortured, arbitrarily detained, facing death penalty.

Syria

Mustafa Sitt Mariam Nasar: Kidnapped, sold to the US, rendered to Syria.

Yemen

Anwar Al Awlaki: arbitrarily detained, released, killed in a drone attack in 2011.

Saudi Arabia

Abu Assad, Abu Layth, Abu Haytham, Abu Muhammad, Abu Umar, Abu Khalid, Abu Yasin: All testified to the systematic use of torture and ill-treatment inside a detention facility in Madinah with the goal to extract false confessions. That same coerced material was then subsequently used to convict the men.

Mohammed Hajib: Kidnapped, tortured, arbitrarily detained

Algeria

AbdelAziz Naji: 8 years in Guantanamo, forcefully returned to Algeria, arbitrarily detained, inhumane conditions of detention.

Kenya

Mohamed Ali Mohamed: Arrested in Tanzania, tortured, false confessions

Libya

Ibn Shaykh al-Libi: Kidnapped, detained in CIA black sites, tortured, rendered to Libya, died in detention.

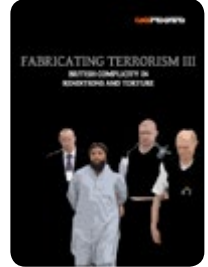
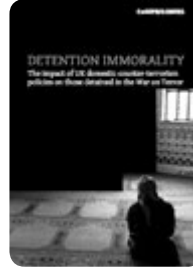
